

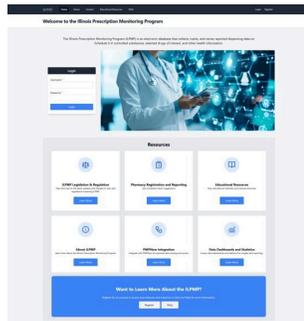

ILPMP To Transition New Website

In early 2026, ILPMP users will transition to the updated version of ILPMP.org at the time of login. Enhancements include: a new modern visual appeal, upgraded infrastructure to decrease wait times on searches, centralized "Resource Hub" to easily access information relevant to ILPMP, and much more.

DEA To Extend Telemedicine Flexibilities

The DEA has extended COVID-19 pandemic-era telemedicine flexibilities for prescribing controlled substances through **December 31, 2026**. This fourth temporary extension allows practitioners to prescribe Schedule II-V controlled medications via audio-video without an in-person evaluation.

IDPH Opioid Overdose Reversal Agent Standing Order

A revised **Illinois Opioid Overdose Reversal Agent Standing Order**, signed by Sameer S. Vohra, MD, the Director of the Illinois Department of Public Health, is now available on the [IDPH website](#). This standing order expires on **October 31, 2026**.



Key Updates in the Revised Standing Order:

Registration Requirement Removed

Registration with IDPH is no longer required. The standing order can now be downloaded directly from the IDPH website.

Medication Brand Names Removed

This standing order lists only the generic medication name

New Formulation Added

Includes Naloxone Single-dose nasal spray - 3 mg/0.1 ml

Libraries Added as Naloxone Entities

Beginning January 2026, Illinois public libraries are included as naloxone entities. This change supports emergency preparedness in cases of overdose on library grounds, nearby areas, or at library-sponsored events. (See: *Illinois Local Library Act, 75 ILCS 5/1-8*)

Reporting for Illinois Retail Pharmacies: All opioid antagonist drugs dispensed by Illinois retail pharmacies must be reported to ILPMP by the end of the business day. Questions can be directed to ILPMP Pharmacy Compliance at DHS.DBHR.PharmacyCompliance@Illinois.gov

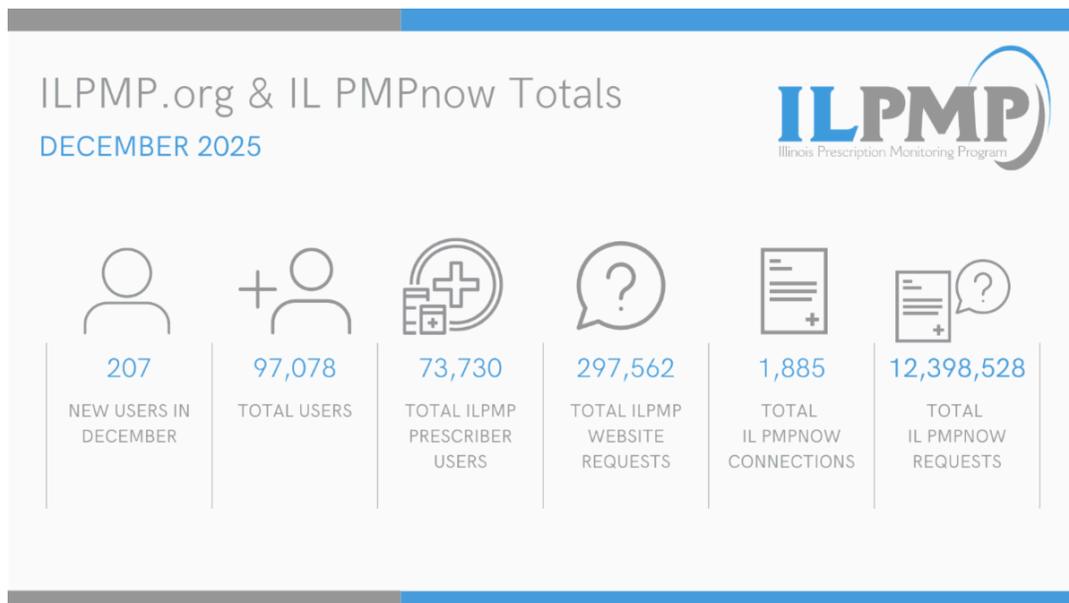

The Illinois Department of Human Services oversees the ILPMP, authorized by the Illinois Controlled Substances Act (720 ILCS 570/316). The ILPMP adheres to HIPAA and all access, disclosure, and confidentiality provisions of Illinois Law.
